From the Dear Brothers and Sisters:
Pastor
As was announced recently, this weekend is the Archbishop's Annual Appeal and we invite everyone to help.
There are many ways that the Archdiocese helps us and provides for the needs of the poor. Of course, there are recent events which may prejudice our opinion of the Archdiocese and we ask that you let go of these things and do what you can. In our giving we should only be concerned with what God sees, not men.

Also I hear that there is some concern among a few of us about the repairs that we are doing in our church. In general, God has somehow provided for them and they have cost us relatively little, a few thousand dollars for the new lights. It is important for us to understand that our church ought to be as beautiful as possible so that it can lift our hearts to the Lord when we worship and pray here. What we are doing for the church is for all of us; it is our church. More yours in a way since priests come and go; hopefully, not as fast as they have in the last ten years. What we do in the church you can say we are doing, first of all, for God, and then for his people. And it should be the best that we can!

Thanks to many people who have a great love for the Church, we have been able to do much of the work here almost for nothing. Many of the things like the candle stands and the tabernacle doors have been here and we just cleaned and polished them. Also we are cleaning and repainting some of the hanging lights at a fraction of the cost an outside company would charge for doing this work. We should give thanks to God for all of this, and to the people who are making this possible.

Many of you say 'thank you,' and that the church looks wonderful, and clean. Also that the preaching is really helping you and you are learning many things about yourself and the faith. We have visited nearly 250 homes since July (only an estimate), and this has brought many people back to church. Also the Faith Formation classes have been visited regularly and some of the children will again receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation after a gap of several years and this is helping them to deal with difficult issues. Probably we did eighty funerals last year which shows the situation of our parish and many parishes in our area. Imagine a company that had these statistics and their absolute need to do something different to survive. I am aware that attendance has dropped and the collections less so, and yet God is somehow helping us. I can only say that as we continue to put God first and to restore the original beauty of our church, many will return and God will send new ones. It is good to reflect on these facts and to see how God's love is being shown to us in a concrete way.


## Church Cleaning

Let us know if you can help with cleaning and vacuuming of the church on Saturdays or any day of the week. There currently is a cleaning crew and more hands would help us to keep it clean and in order and also to prepare the flowers and other decorations.

## House Blessing

During Christmas and Easter is a normal time for families to have their houses blessed and since we are in between both feasts this tradition can continue and it is a good way to get to know one another.
